Thank you so much for your continued support of adoptive and foster families through Replanted. This year, I thought it might be helpful to share a story of one family who has been positively impacted by Replanted.

Charles and Ariel were struggling. They had felt called to adopt a teenage girl through international adoption, but they couldn't have prepared for how challenging it would be. Their once peaceful home became a space of unbelievable difficulties for everyone. They were in a tender spot, struggling with their parenting, their marriage, and their relationship with God. At one point, things became so difficult that they were considering relinquishment of their parental rights. But how could they ever talk to anyone about this without feeling judged. Would anyone understand?

One of their friends told them about the Replanted conference and encouraged them to go. At first, they didn't want to go. They had been to conferences before, and they didn't feel like they had the energy to put on a "happy face" and pretend to be optimistic about where they were at as a family. But as they looked through the breakout sessions, they saw many topics that spoke to them, including one specifically on considering relinquishment. They thought that if Replanted had the courage to talk about these kinds of difficult topics, maybe they could go.

The conference was a game-changer for their family. They were able to show up exactly where they were at—no happy faces required. God met them where they were at, and they felt loved and cared for—not only by God but by the Replanted community. They were also able to access additional resources to meet the needs of their family moving forward. After the conference, they were "all-in" with Replanted, even joining a Replanted small group in their local area to get continued support throughout the year. Although not all their problems were "fixed," they felt more equipped and supported to meet the challenges they were facing. Life with their daughter improved.

This is just one story out of many that families who have been involved with Replanted have shared with us. In 2023, more than 1200 people attended our conference (impacting over 2100 children)—494 in person and 708 at simulcast locations and online—representing the largest number of attendees to date. We also launched 8 new support groups last year, bringing our Replanted support groups total to 42 small groups (serving 280 families, with 752 children involved). We were also able to launch a new website, which enables families to more easily find information about our small groups, conference, and other resources. The website also has a leader portal, which helps our small group leaders stay connected to one another and receive ongoing training and support.

In 2024, we continue to focus on our mission and vision, confident in our ability to provide even more support for adoptive and foster families. Because of your generosity, along with a generous 3-year grant from Lilly Endowment Inc., we were able to hire two part-time small group coordinators to assist with launching and supporting small groups and their leaders. Our goal is that no adoptive or foster family has to walk this journey alone. Thank you for your partnership with Replanted—your prayers, your volunteer hours, and your financial support. Together we are impacting the world through supporting families.

MISSION

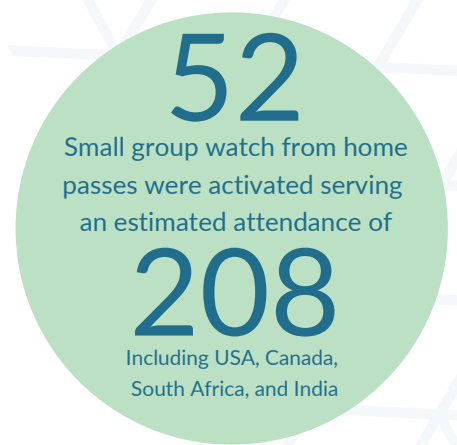
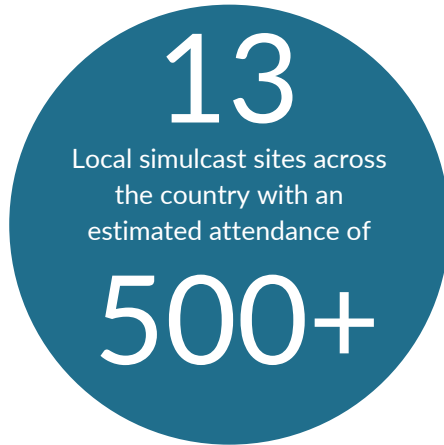

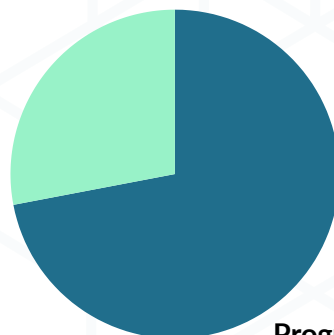
